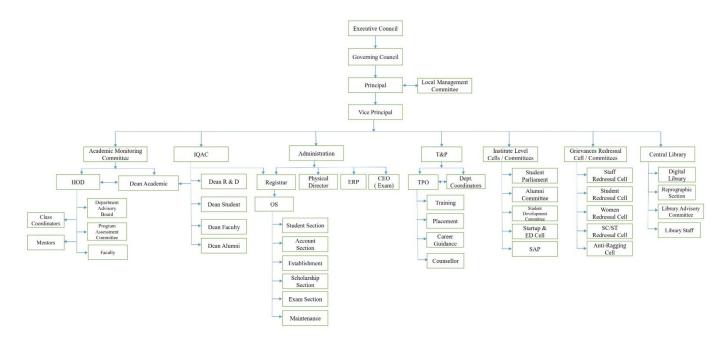

#### 5.6 Mechanism/ Norms and Procedure for democratic/ good Governance:

The institute has provided ERP portal for effective planning and maintaining record of teaching activities.

Each faculty maintains the record of scheduled and conducted lectures/ practical's, topics covered in each lecture/lab session and attendance of students. The same data is also entered through ERP system which can be accessed by head of departments, Principal and Management authorities for regular monitoring. Student performance in laboratory is maintained in continuous assessment record.

Every department appoints a class coordinator for each class. Class coordinators ensure that the sessions are conducted as per the schedule. Alternate arrangement is made in case of absence of faculty. The monthly attendance record is maintained by class coordinator and communicated to head of department. The academic activities and progress of students

are reviewed by head of the department with the help of class coordinators and corrective measures are discussed with the faculty in department meetings. Curriculum gaps are identified and bridged by means of expert talks, seminars, workshops, training courses, industrial visits and inclusion of topics beyond syllabus. Timely feedback from students, faculty, alumni, employers, parents, external examiners/project guides are taken into account to ensure achievement of learning outcomes.

Regularly, meeting with all head of departments is called by the Principal to review academic activities, to address the issues pertaining to teaching learning process and planning of forth coming activities to ensure smooth conduction. For regular monitoring of academic activities, a monthly report is prepared at department level and submitted to Principal and management.

The management also conducts meetings with Principal, head of departments and concerned faculty membersas and when required for planning, execution and funding for various activities.

Key performance indicators (KPI) are identified, monitored and reviewed in the meeting with Advisory Committee for the KBTCOE, which is scheduled every three months.

#### 5.7 Student Feedback on Institutional Governance/ Faculty performance

The institute has excellent infrastructure with well-developed and equipped laboratories, Wi Fi campus. Other facilities provided to the students include gymnasium and sports, hostels for girls, mess and canteen etc. Regular feedback is collected from the stake holders to improve the academic and infrastructural standards of the institute.

The institute monitors and evaluates the quality of teaching learning through:

- Strict adherence to course conduction and completion
- In every semester, feedback is collected from the students and analyzed. Outcome of this process is communicated to respective staff for their improvement as well as for encouragement.
- Lecture observation is made by head of the department and Principal and necessary feedback and suggestions are conveyed to respective faculty for further improvement.

#### Monitoring through IQAC

Student feedback for the respective course is conducted twice in each semester online through ERP System.https://erp.kbtcoe.org/

It is based on the parameters like punctuality, preparation for the lecture, communication skills, interaction digheory and practical etc.

In addition, a suggestion box is kept near the office. Appropriate measures are taken based on the suggests/feedback received. This will serve as one of the yardstick used for faculty appraisal.

#### 5.8 Grievance Redressal mechanism for Faculty, staff and students

A separate Grievance redressal cell is formed to look into the matter related to grievances. Also, Teaching and Non-Teaching Staff members can approach the respective heads of the department, Registrar, and Principal for redressal of any grievance. The College Development Committee is also formed as per the Savitribai Phule Pune University regulations. Students can approach their respective class coordinators, Head of the department, Registrar, & Principal for their grievances. Suggestion boxes are also provided. Parents meetings are conducted every year and the inputs are used for continual improvement.

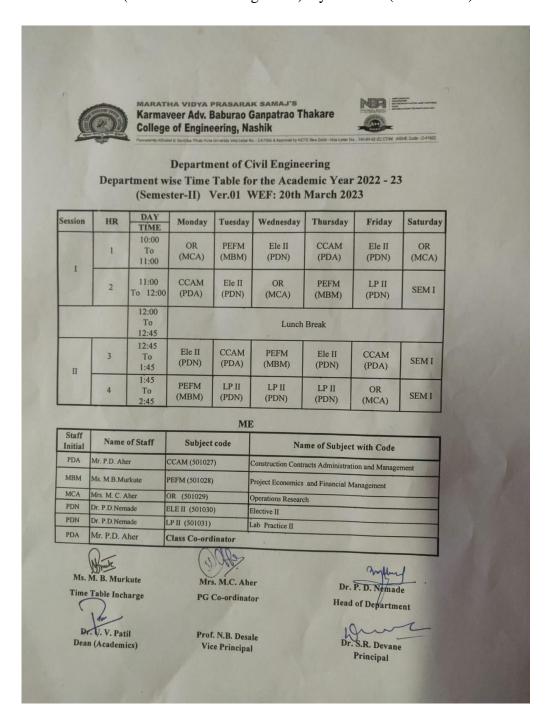
